through international case studies this book explores the causes and effects of historical and contemporary cultural changes in art education a general broadening of content and methods a renewed emphasis on student interests and diverse critical perspectives can currently be seen internationally in art curricula this book explores ways that visual culture in education is helping to move art curricula off their historical foundations and open the field to new ways of teaching learning and prefiguring worlds it highlights critical histories and contemporary stories showing how cultural milieu influences and is influenced by the various practices that make up the professional field inside and outside of institutional borders this book shows students how contemporary art educators are responding revising and re-creating the field

providing a distillation of knowledge in the various disciplines of arts education dance drama music literature and poetry and visual arts this essential handbook synthesizes existing research literature reflects on the past and contributes to shaping the future of the respective and integrated disciplines of arts education while research can at times seem distant from practice the handbook aims to maintain connection with the live practice of art and of education capturing the vibrancy and best thinking in the field of theory and practice the handbook is organized into 13 sections each focusing on a major area or issue in arts education research

art as unlearning makes an argument for art s unlearning as a mannerist pedagogy art s pedagogy facilitates a form of forgetfulness by extending what happens in the practice of the arts in their visual auditory and performative forms the concept of learning has become predominantly hijacked by foundational paradigms such as developmental narratives whose positivistic approach has limited the field of education to a narrow practice within the social sciences this book moves away from these strictures by showing how the arts confirm that unlearning is not contingent on learning but rather anticipates and avoids it this book cites the experience and work of artists who by unlearning the canon have opened a diversity of possibilities by which we make and live the world moving beyond clichés of art s teachability and what we have to learn through the arts it advances a scenario where unlearning is uniquely presented to us by the diverse practices that we identify with the arts the very notion of art as unlearning stems from and represents a fundamental critique of the constructivist pedagogies that have dominated arts education for over half a century this book will be of great interest to academics researchers and postgraduate students in the fields of education philosophy of education history of education pedagogy of art and art education it will also appeal to educators art educators and artists interested in the pedagogy of art

the routledge companion to art and politics offers a thorough examination of the complex relationship between art and politics and the many forms and approaches the engagement between them can take the contributors a diverse assembly of artists activists scholars from around the world discuss and demonstrate ways of making art and politics legible and salient in the world as such the 32 chapters in this volume reflect on performing and visual arts music film and new media as well as covering social practice community based work

conceptual interventionist and movement affiliated forms the companion is divided into four distinct parts conceptual cartographies institutional materialities modalities of practice making publics randy martin has assembled a collection that ensures that readers will come away with a wider view of what can count as art and politics where they might find it and how it moves in the world the diversity of perspectives is at once challenging and fortifying to those who might dismiss political art on the one hand as not making sufficient difference and on the other to those embracing it but seeking a means to elaborate the significance that it can make in the world the routledge companion to art and politics brings together a range of issues and approaches and encourages critical and creative thinking about how art is produced perceived and received

contemporary issues in art education by yvonne gaudelius and peg speirs is a collection of essays that are framed around social issues art and teaching using an issues based approach the authors provide a valuable resource for teaching issues based content especially as these issues are explored through contemporary art and visual culture in the classroom the authors present ideas for educators at all levels who want to incorporate an issues based approach to teaching this book combines theoretical perspectives with tangible and practical strategies for generating content and pedagogical approaches the book while primarily written for pre service elementary teachers will prove useful to general classroom teachers and art educators at all levels whether they are teaching in the k 12 or the college classroom the authors in this book are highly respected within the field of art education they provide thoughtful approaches to a

realm of complex ideas encompassing artistic social political and educational issues readers will develop and understanding of a variety of ways to teach about such issues in the classroom how to draw upon the contemporary artworld and a sense of the critical frameworks within which we need to explore such issues
